### **Unique JFCS Program Embraces Choices, Creates Opportunities for Teens on Drugs, Alcohol**

Embracing Choices - Creating Opportunities, aka ECCO, is a unique, therapeutic program of JFCS that encourages young people 13 to 18 to overcome their substance abuse issues, which include alcohol and other drugs.

What makes the program unique is its focus on the family. When it comes to substance abuse, few programs in Pima County address the needs of the entire family. It has been shown that when parents and other family members participate in their family member's therapy, the chances for recovery are increased.

There are weekly group therapy sessions and individual and family therapy. Groups are free to attend, thanks to the support of the Governor's Office for Children, Youth and Families, Arizona Parents Commission on Drug Education and Prevention.
