Call for Volunteers to Assist Medical-Equipment Program; You Can Help Today by Donating Lightly Used Items!

The Irving Greenfield Tucson Loan Chest is undergoing the biggest transition of its history. This summer, the medical-equipment program will acquire an updated name and a new home in central Tucson.

In its new headquarters at Alvernon Boulevard and Pima Street, the Tucson Loan Chest will expand its already popular program of providing low-cost, used medical equipment to the greater Tucson area. The new location will provide a broader, more convenient platform in which to rent, sell and accept quality durable medical equipment, such as wheelchairs, walkers, hospital beds, raised toilet seats, shower chairs, canes and much more. All equipment is inspected for safety, repaired, if needed, and sanitized in accordance with federal Occupational Safety & Health Administration standards before being rented or sold. Pick-up service for donations and delivery service for people who are renting or purchasing is available.

To help out by donating lightly used durable medical equipment, for which you will be provided a tax



receipt, contact 624-3367 Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to noon or visit us in our current home in the Community Food Bank Building, 3003 S. Country Club Road, during those same hours or by appointment. You may also send us a message at loanchest@jfcstucson.org.

Not only does the program need donations, it also has an immediate need for great volunteers with administrative, computer and retail skills to greet the public, help clients find what they need and process rentals and sales. For these administrative positions, volunteers should be detail-oriented, accurate and exhibit good "people skills." They also need to be physically fit enough to be able to lift 50 pounds.



Volunteers are also needed to inspect, repair, clean and sanitize donated equipment. These maintenance/repair volunteers should be experienced in the use of hand/power tools and be able to work around and with sanitizing chemicals. They also should be able to lift 50 pounds and be able to push 100 pounds.

The Agency will train all volunteers to work in these positions at the new Tucson Loan Chest.
